### Key vocabulary

<b>Print</b>	A print is an impression made by any method involving transfer from one surface to another.
<b>Repeating pattern</b>	Repetition refers to one object or shape repeated in a recurring and regular arrangement.
<b>Nature print</b>	Nature printing process, developed in the 18 <sup>th</sup> century that uses the plants, animals, rocks and other natural subjects to produce and image.
<b>Press, roll, run and stamp</b>	Different techniques for printing in art.
<b>Lino Print</b>	Lino print is a printmaking technique regularly used in art and design. A design is cut into the lino surface with a cutter, the lino sheet is inked with a roller, and then pressed onto paper or any other fabric design or to create art for a display.

### Artists

**William Morris (24 March 1834- 3 October 1896)** was a British textile designer, poet, novelist, translator and socialist activist associated with the British Arts and Crafts Movement. He was a major contributor to the revival of traditional British textile arts.
